



RSE & PSHE Intent, Implementation & Impact



Intent:

At Heage Primary School, our RSE and PSHE curriculum is intended to develop learning resulting in the acquisition of knowledge and skills that enables children to access the wider curriculum and to prepare children to be a global citizen now and in their future roles within a global community.

We follow the Kapow Primary scheme for RSE and PSHE. The scheme aims to give children the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that they need to effectively navigate the complexities of life in the 21st Century. The curriculum covers key areas which will support children to make informed choices now and in the future around their health, safety, wellbeing, relationships, and financial matters and will support them in becoming confident individuals and active members of society. Kapow Primary's RSE/PSHE scheme of work covers the Relationships and Health Education statutory guidance (as set out by the Department for Education), including the non-statutory sex education.

Our school values of Kindness, Resilience, Compassion, Honesty, Teamwork and Respect are interwoven into our PSHE curriculum. We believe that quality RSE and PSHE education also helps our duty of care with safeguarding, as outlined in the DfE's statutory 'Keeping Children Safe in Education.'

Implementation:

The Kapow Primary scheme is a whole school approach that consists of three areas of learning in EYFS (to match the EYFS Personal, social and emotional development prime area) and five areas of learning across Key stages 1 and 2.

EYFS: Self-regulation, Building relationships, Managing self.

Key stage 1 and 2: Families and relationships, Health and wellbeing, Safety and the changing body, Citizenship, Economic wellbeing.

Each area is revisited to allow children to build on prior learning. The lessons also provide a progressive programme. Lessons are based upon the statutory requirements for Relationships and Health education, but where our lessons go beyond these requirements (primarily in the Citizenship and Economic wellbeing areas) they refer to the PSHE Association Programme of Study which is recommended by the DfE.

Explicit lessons are 30+ minutes each week. In addition, PSHE, British Values and SMSC themes are revisited during assemblies and are discretely taught throughout the curriculum.

Impact:

- Children will know more and remember more about PSHE.
- Children will demonstrate and apply the British Values: Democracy, Rule of Law, Respect and Tolerance and Individual Liberty.
- Children will demonstrate a healthy outlook towards school – attendance will be in-line with national and behaviour will be good.
- Children will become healthy and responsible members of society
- Children will be prepared for life and work in modern Britain.
- Children will develop positive and healthy relationship with their peers both now and in the future.
- Children will understand the physical aspects involved in RSE at an age appropriate level.
- Children will have respect for themselves and others.
- Children will have positive body images.
