Our curriculum allows children at Heage to succeed in RSE and PSHE by:

We follow Kapow Primary's scheme of work which is based on RSE Statutory guidance (and non-statutory sex education) and the PSHE Association's Program of Study. The core themes of: family and relationships, health and well-being, safety and the changing body, citizenship and economic well-being are woven within the curriculum. These themes, and the knowledge and vocabulary associated with them, are built upon each year, increasing in complexity from FS2 to year 6.

Thoughtful and respectful discussions take place during PSHE lessons. In addition, to teaching resources, we have a variety of pastoral resources for all teachers and TAs to access including: daily emotional check-ins, worry boxes, a learning mentor, well-being heroes. Assemblies support PSHE themes, British Values. We also hold special whole school events such as Anti-Bullying, Children's mental health and Internet Safety weeks.
