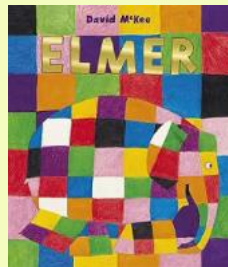
Grammar Coverage
